NSW PMA State Meeting

The NSW State meeting was held last night, 6th May, at the North Ryde Pittwater Function Centre. There were about forty attendees made up of suppliers and retailers including IPS, Spectrum Brookvale, DigiDirect, Leading Edge, Raleru, Photo Direct, C R Kennedy, Paxtons, John Ralph's Camera House, Smarter Digital Photography, Profile Products, Maxwell International, Olympus Imaging, The Framing School and GFK.

Speakers were Neville Ray and Min Woo Jeong from GFK, June Anderson from the Framing School and John Ralph from Camera House.

NSW PMA Chair, Mark Alderson, talked about the changes in the industry and individuals struggling on their own. He reinforced the need for co-operation and working together as specialists and that, as members, retailers and suppliers we need to work together as an industry, targeting specific consumers, educating hobbyists for customer retention. It is up to us to provide new services and come up with new ways for consumer engagement.

Connecting With Members

Connecting with Sandra Ryan, Alice Springs Camera House

One of the great joys of my role with **PMA** is talking to members, whether it is answering an enquiry, taking a renewal, booking an event, sharing a joke or hearing stories. This week I was lucky enough to spend some time with **Sandra Ryan** sharing her story...who knew!

Sandra is a quiet achiever; multi-tasking to help in the family business, assisting her children, her grandchildren, her Mum, Dawn and 98 year old Grandmother, Alice. A caring, warm, creative and loving human being, with a real sense of humour and a kind heart, Sandra has been married to Jerome Ryan for 40 years, they have two children (David and Denelle) who are both single parents; and three grandchildren (9, 4, 2). At any given time, there can be up to seven people living at their house!

As far as the business is concerned, Alice Springs

Camera House was established in the early 50's and has been family owned since 1969. However, it's a complicated story, which ebbs and flows, with twists and turns that keep you guessing. It starts with father, **John Ryan** and four sons, two of whom have been involved with the family business. Damien, the second son was the first to put his hand up, and in 1972 took over its management, actually buying it in 1974. At some point he left to go into the tourism industry as licensee of the Mt Ebenezer Roadhouse and later was co-owner of Dunmarra Roadhouse. In 2008 he was elected Mayor of Alice Springs and was again re-elected in 2012.



So back in 1973, Sandra also worked in the business for a short time and there was Jerome, a Traffic Officer with TAA, who in the early 80's had started working with a local electrical company, when Damien asked him to come and take over the management of the Camera store. Jerome had no knowledge at all about photography so it is a testament to his ability that he successfully grew the business and after 10 years on his own, Damien came back...the plot thickens! They worked together, continuing to expand until they had three stores, with 26 staff at one point.

In the midst of this, Jerome and Sandra were married in 1974, had children in 1978 and 1979. Sandra's Grandmother, Alice was a skilled tailor who made beautiful clothing and taught Sandra to draught patterns and sew from the age of 9. From the age of 19 and for about 25 years Sandra worked in her own business full time, making curtains, cushions, bedspreads, pelmets, bedheads from their soft furnishing workshop so she was with the kids. Sandra has made bridal and formal gowns for many family members and friends over the years.

She worked for many years in one of their acquisitions, a framing store, later owned by Jerome's youngest brother Adam and his wife Veronica, where she was hands on and honed her creative skills, leaving there to help Jerome in the Camera House, having also worked previously in one of the photo stores for six years. These days, the three stores are combined into one; Damien isn't in the business; Jerome works 7 days a week and Sandra works full-time doing the administration work. This year is also Jerome's 30th year in the business.

As for the next generation, Denelle did her apprenticeship of photography and printing working with Damien and Jerome. She started as a teenager, now has a 2 year old son and is about to take over all the IT work and social media for the business from home.

There isn't much time for hobbies but they enjoy having their toddler grandson living with them, and have just finished helping their son, David (a concreter) renovate their rental property; it has been hard work, with lots of people helping, as they had to practically re-build the whole house. They have renovated three properties over the years, Sandra loves it but the others aren't that keen. She is also passionate about her photos and family history and after a trip to France in 2010 would love nothing better than to spend a few months living there.

Over the last 16 months or so, Sandra's family has had a very difficult time and work has had to take a back seat while she has tried to support her extended family. In December 2012 her niece, Jessie, who was 22, was murdered in South Australia; on the day of her funeral, Sandra's 27 year old nephew, whose wife was expecting their first child, also died accidentally. Jessie was bought up by her Great Grandparents, Noel and Isobel Fullerton, and Isobel passed away from the pain and stress of Jessie's death in September 2013. Since then, Sandra's sister and Mum have both been dealing with breast cancer.

Sandra says out of tragedy has come something good - Robert's little baby daughter Annabella was born and will soon have her 1st birthday having spent many months in hospital. Jessie was the type of person who got everyone together, was full of fun - now the family get together more often and have become closer, so Jess's magic continues!

Maybe some of that magic came from **Noel Fullerton**, a character without doubt. Sandra's Uncle and Jess's Great grandfather, Noel was responsible for the

instigation of the **Camel Race** in the dry Todd River Bed. The Camel race proved so popular and hilarious that plans were made by the Lions Club to hold the event on an annual basis. In 1979 it found its current home at the Noel Fullerton Camel Racing Arena. Built by volunteers, Blatherskite Park is the only purpose built camel racing venue in the southern hemisphere with a commentary and judges' tower being erected, for telephone contact to the pits and centre arena to keep the crowd informed.

Talking to Sandra, it really brought home that we just don't know what is going on in people's lives; that we can't judge anyone by what is showing externally, but if we stop and listen maybe we will get to know someone better. Way to go Sandra...what an inspiration you are!

Alice Springs Camera House looks after locals, travellers and those in the outlying regions with a full range of photographic products and services. They are presently gearing up for a busy time with the tourist season from May to September, with a short lull before the Christmas rush.
