One of the country's most respected professional portrait and wedding print photography awards programme returns for another edition in 2013.

The Kodak Professional Gold Awards returns this year, slightly later than usual, and is now inviting pro photographers to submit their best work commissioned by a customer to be judged and vie for gold and silver medals.

The competition comprises four categories – Wedding: Bride and/or Groom, Wedding: Group, Portrait: Individual, and Portrait: Group – there will be no Wedding Album category this year.

All prints must be received by November 29, printed on Kodak photographic or inkjet paper, and mounted on 16x20-inch sheets of card or foam board – see the [Kodak New Zealand Facebook page](#) for full details.

Winners are selected by a judging panel of experts in a closed-door session and successful photographers will be notified no later than December 18.
